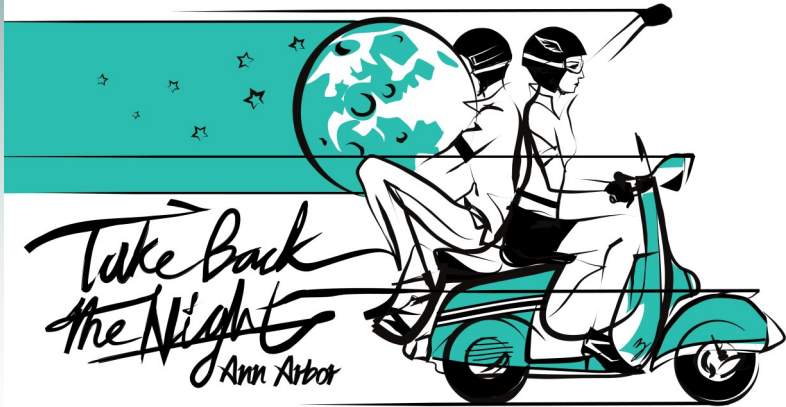

Drew Dixon—Our Keynote speaker



is a music producer, television producer, writer and #MeToo Silence Breaker.

During her career in the music industry, Drew oversaw the recording of hit records like "Maria Maria", "My Love Is Your Love" and "A Rose Is Still A Rose" with artists including Carlos Santana, Whitney Houston, Aretha Franklin, Lauryn Hill, Monica, Brandy, Deborah Cox, Method Man, Q-Tip, Brand Nubian, Mary J. Blige, John Legend, Estelle, Kanye West and more. She was a Vice President of A&R at Arista Records, a Director of A&R at Def Jam Recordings and the General Manager of John Legend's independent record label, Homeschool (Atlantic), where she oversaw the recording of Estelle's Grammy winning single, *American Boy*.

In 2017 Drew broke her silence in *The New York Times* about sexual assault and harassment in the music industry. She is the main subject of HBO Max documentary, *On The Record*, directed by Academy Award nominated filmmakers, Amy Ziering and Kirby Dick. She is also an honors graduate of Harvard Business School's MBA program and a graduate of Stanford University.

Drew lives with her two children and their two cats, George and Weezie, in Brooklyn, NY, where she is writing a memoir for Harper Collins and producing music and other original content for her new multi-media company, CLAIM.

2022 March Route

Please leave the Union in an orderly manner. Wait on State Street until those with the banner start walking with police escort.

Each year, one block of the march is chosen to be silent, in order to remember and honor those who have died as a result of sexual violence. Just before we begin the silent block, which is part of Thompson Street, organizers will move through the crowd and ask all marchers to stop chanting and drumming. Marchers in front will hold up a special banner throughout the block. When the banner is turned around, we will resume chanting and drumming.

Please stay in the lane going in the direction of traffic. Also, if you are unable to keep up with the march, please move to the sidewalk for safety reasons.

Facts and Statistics

1 in 3 women and 1 in 6 men will experience some form of sexual violence in their lifetime. 1 in 6 women and 1 in 33 men have experienced an attempted or completed rape in their lifetime.

College-age women are 4 times more likely to be assaulted.

Each year there are about 300,000 victims of sexual assault.

Every 98 seconds, someone in the US is assaulted.

68% of sexual assaults are not reported to the police. 98% of assailants will never spend a day in prison or jail.

Approximately 2/3's of rape victims know their assailants.
