

2024 March Route

Please leave the Union in a orderly manner. Wait on State Street until those with the banner start walking with police escort. Each year, one block of the march is chosen to be silent, in order to remember and honor those who have died as a result of sexual violence. Just before we begin the silent block, which is part of Thompson Street, organizers will move through the crowd and ask all marchers to stop chanting and drumming. Marchers in front will hold up a special banner throughout the block. When the banner is turned around, we will resume chanting and drumming. Please stay in the lane going in the direction of traffic. Also, if you are unable to keep up with the

march, please move to the sidewalk for safety reasons

Facts and Statistics

1 in 3 women and 1 in 6 men will experience some form of sexual violence in their lifetime. 1 in 6 women and 1 in 33 men have experienced an attempted or completed rape in their lifetime.

College-age women are 4 times more likely to be assaulted.

Each year there are about 300,000 victims of sexual assault.

Every 98 seconds, someone in the US is assaulted.

68% of sexual assaults are not reported to the police. 98% of assailants will never spend a day in prison or jail.

Approximately 2/3's of rape victims know their assailants.
